# Electronic Giving instructions

The following information is for those who would like to skip the step of manually filling out and mailing or dropping off your pledge card.

If you choose to send in a Pledge card, that is ok. I will happily enter this information for you!!!

To set up a pledge from a Mobile app or laptop, follow these simple steps. Depending on the device you are using, the screens could be slightly different.


1. Log into the Realm App. Click on **GIVING**. Depending on your type of device, the GIVING may be on the side, top or bottom.







2. On the next screen click on "Pledge". Again, this may be at the bottom or top of the screen. No worries, the Pledge info will NOT auto draft bank or credit card information.

3. At the next screen it may say "make a pledge" or "Pledge now". At the top of the screen enter the amount you would like to pledge. Since we are tracking annual amounts, you can choose "annually" from the drop down tab.



4. At this time click on "save pledge" **THIS IS IMPORTANT.** By selecting ONLY this tab, NO auto draft of checking or credit card will take place. This is simply to track Pledge information ONLY.

5. The next screen will tell you that you have successfully set up your pledge for the year. You will also receive an email telling you that you have successfully added a pledge

Again, this will NOT draft your gift to the Church, you will continue to send your gift to the Church as you already do. (check, online, etc..)

Baby Kits

It's that time of year to be thinking about Lutheran World Relief. We have several ladies that have been sewing off and on all year on their own to make blankets and jackets. Some people have been buying shirts and pants but we still need more supplies. Each kit which contains – 2 receiving size blankets, 2 t-shirts (between the size of 3 months to 24 months), 2 pjs (or another 2 t-shirt and pants sizes 3 months - 24 months), jacket with hood or include a stocking cap, 2 pairs of socks, bar of soap (total weight between 8-9 oz.), hand towel, 4 cloth diapers, and 2 safety pins has a monetary value of between \$20 and \$30 dollars. We are doing good on the clothing items but still need the hand towels, soap and cloth diapers. If you would like to donate items or money that would be greatly appreciated. I ordered the diapers on Amazon Prime and got the 200 diapers we need for 50 kits for \$214.88 including tax (I was able to get them on sale).

We will be having a sewing day Sept 21<sup>st</sup> from 9:00 am until around 3:00 come and go as you desire. We need not only people with sewing machines but also people to cut out items or do some simple hand sewing (buttons and snaps). Let's make this a fun day of fellowship and service.

We will not be working on the baby kits on Sept 12<sup>th</sup> as previously announced as we don't have enough items to start putting the kits together. Watch for an announcement on the day for that.

Recently, some maintenance was required for our air conditioning units. While the required work was considered routine, the bill ended up being substantially higher than expected. Even after a renegotiation of the bill, the due balance is \$4,024.36 (Thank you Ray for getting this lowered over \$1,000). Additionally, it was discovered that more work, requiring the replacement of our units will likely be required in future years. Given our exceedingly tight fiscal year, this bill far exceeds the property committee's budget. I would ask you to please consider giving a special gift for this purpose. Any size gift would be greatly beneficial! Simply designate your gift toward this special offering, and we will make sure that it gets to where you intend. As always, thank you for your generosity.

# Care for Creation

## *Plastic Free Ecochallenge 2021—Collective Impact*

*Mary Mertz signed up for this month-long challenge in July. Here's her report.*

Hello, Redeemer friends – I decided to try out this ecochallenge, thinking that if it went well I would invite other people to subsequent challenges. It was fun! I will definitely let you know the next time an opportunity like this comes along. You get to choose your own actions and then measure your success based on those choices. I confess I got a kick out of seeing the program's little graphics celebrate every time I met one of my daily goals.

There were 6,522 participants in 53 countries. Together we did 128,406 actions to reduce our plastic usage. Some of the actions I chose were Skip the Straw, Use Reusable Containers, Use Reusable Utensils, and Minimize Packaging. Next year I'm game to try Cook a Zero-Plastic-Waste Meal.

One action I signed up for but failed to do was Pack Your Own Travel Snacks. But I sure noticed how much plastic I used for all my prepackaged snacks! Although I wasn't perfectly successful, I enjoyed the challenge and look forward to doing it again next year.

He will be teaching with and playing the new three manual Rodgers 599T organ we recently installed in the chapel. This free workshop is intended to help organists of all ages and ability levels....this means you! I hope to see you there!

On Sunday, September 19<sup>th</sup> at 4:00 pm Dan Miller will perform at First Presbyterian Church in Ellsworth. The 14 rank Austin pipe organ has recently been renovated and upgraded featuring a new Rodgers Infinity 243 console with over 200 pipe quality digital stops complimenting the original 910 windblown pipes. Please join us as we celebrate God's gift of music in our lives.



Dan Miller is internationally renowned as an organist with an extensive concert schedule. A professional member of the American Society of Composers and Publishers, Dan Miller is well-known for his composing and arranging, and has several published works. He has been seen and heard live in concert and through recordings on radio, television, and the internet, and has been the featured solo organist with several symphony orchestras. He is a former Dean of the Ft. Lauderdale chapter of The American Guild of Organists and is a member of the Portland chapter AGO. He is an Adjunct Professor of Organ at George Fox University in Newberg, Oregon.

2021 marks Dan's 22nd year at Rodgers Instruments US LLC, one of the world's leading organ builders, located in Hillsboro, Oregon, USA. He is responsible for the artistic and musical decisions for the Rodgers' sound, selection of stops, pipe organ samples and orchestral voices, and console layouts. He performs final musical testing of each organ before it is packaged and shipped worldwide from the factory. In addition, he does product training for sales representatives and technicians, but what he enjoys most is celebrating new organ installations around the world with workshops, concerts, and other musical events.

<sup>24</sup>[Jesus] set out and went away to the region of Tyre. He entered a house and did not want anyone to know he was there. Yet he could not escape notice,<sup>25</sup> but a woman whose little daughter had an unclean spirit immediately heard about him, and she came and bowed down at his feet. <sup>26</sup>Now the woman was a Gentile, of Syrophenician origin. She begged him to cast the demon out of her daughter. <sup>27</sup>He said to her, "Let the children be fed first, for it is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the dogs." <sup>28</sup>But she answered him, "Sir, even the dogs under the table eat the children's crumbs." <sup>29</sup>Then he said to her, "For saying that, you may go—the demon has left your daughter." <sup>30</sup>So she went home, found the child lying on the bed, and the demon gone. <sup>31</sup>Then he returned from the region of Tyre, and went by way of Sidon towards the Sea of Galilee, in the region of the Decapolis. <sup>32</sup>They brought to him a deaf man who had an impediment in his speech; and they begged him to lay his hand on him. <sup>33</sup>He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, and put his fingers into his ears, and he spat and touched his tongue. <sup>34</sup>Then looking up to heaven, he sighed and said to him, "Ephphatha," that is, "Be opened." <sup>35</sup>And immediately his ears were opened, his tongue was released, and he spoke plainly. <sup>36</sup>Then Jesus ordered them to tell no one; but the more he ordered them, the more zealously they proclaimed it. <sup>37</sup>They were astounded beyond measure, saying, "He has done everything well; he even makes the deaf to hear and the mute to speak."

Peter answered him, "You are the Messiah." <sup>30</sup>And he sternly ordered them not to tell anyone about him. <sup>31</sup>Then he began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. <sup>32</sup>He said all this quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. <sup>33</sup>But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan!
