Safe Families: This year we are trying to help children who have been placed in a program called Safe Families. Safe Families is a volunteer-driven program that supports families in crisis to prevent child abuse and neglect by providing a temporary "circle of support" for children and their parents. The program, which is rooted in biblical hospitality and compassion, aims to keep families stay intact by offering solutions like temporary hosting for children in the homes of trained volunteers, mentoring, and other support services to prevent social isolation. This service helps children from birth to eighteen years of age. These children are in need of the following items listed on the sheets near the welcome center.
