¹⁶ We did not follow cleverly devised myths when we
made known to you the power and coming of our Lord

Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. ¹⁷ For he received honor and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, “This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased.” ¹⁸ We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain.

¹⁹ So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. For Lent this year we will be doing a video series prepared by Pastor Adam Hamilton of Church of the Resurrection, located in Leawood, Kansas . This series guides us through the last day of Jesus' life. Pastor Hamilton took his film crew to the Holy Land and filmed at the actual sites of the last day of Jesus' life. Each of the sessions will have opening prayer, a scripture reading, a video , 3 discussion questions , closing prayer and a hymn. Each session will last 30 minutes.

Sessions will be at 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday evenings. Session 1 on February 25 and is entitled

“The Last Supper”; Session 2 on March 4 will have “The Garden of Gethsemane; “Sessions 3 on March 11 will be “Condemned by the Righteous”; Session 4 on March 18 is “ Jesus, Barabbas and Pilate”; Session 5 on March 25 will be “The Torture and the Humiliation of the King” and Session 6 on April 1 will be the “The Crucifixion.” There will be a light Lenten meal before each session at 6:15 p.m.
